

SPOTLIGHT ON A GRADUATE

The Future of Good award is a humanitarian award distributed by U.S. Cellular that "champions and invests in youth who are doing good things in their communities." It's a national level recognition prize awarded to only 5 young people in the country.

Ryan was nominated for the award because of his ability to lead the 2016 Teens as an Educator and for his service on the Teens Grow Greens Board of Directors.

After reading about his role and a short conversation, the Future of Good representatives selected Ryan.

The prize was a \$4,000 donation to help expand Teens Grow Greens, \$6,000 to a scholarship fund in his name (The Ryan Graham Scholarship of Excellence), a documentary about his story (find it on the U.S. Cellular homepage on November 29th), and an all expenses paid trip to New York in December for a media coverage event at the New York Stock Exchange to recognize all the Future of Good recipients.

Thanks to U.S. Cellular's generosity, Teens Grow Greens will be able to reach out into another community and leave a positive impact. Thanks to the scholarship, Ryan will be able to fund some of his college costs and he will continue to reward excellence by leading the selection committee to other youth who are outstanding leaders.


